

B-21 EXECUTIVE SESSIONS

A Board may have an executive session only for the purpose of discussing certain matters specified in the Open Door Law provided the proper statutory notice has been given.

Executive sessions should be kept at a minimum. NO MOTION SHALL BE MADE OR ACTION TAKEN IN EXECUTIVE SESSION. The only purpose of such session is to discuss the issues.

A Board may not conduct an executive session during a meeting for any purpose, but may hold an executive session before or after a meeting if proper notice has been given. Public notice of an executive session must state its purpose or subject matter. General memorandum and minutes must be kept of an executive session, but the regular requirements that such memorandum or minutes be made available to the public are modified as to executive sessions in that they need only identify the general subject considered.
