

J-10 STUDENT WITHDRAWAL FROM SCHOOL EXIT INTERVIEW

Under Indiana law, any student who is at least sixteen (16) years of age but is not yet eighteen (18) years of age, may withdraw from school prior to graduation after an exit interview with the student's parent or guardian and the student's principal is conducted and the following conditions are met:

1. An exit interview is conducted.
2. The student's parent or guardian consents to the withdrawal.
3. The withdrawal is due to:
 - a. financial hardship and the individual must be employed to support the student's family or dependent;
 - b. illness; or
 - c. an order by a court that has jurisdiction over the child.

The Board of School Trustees for the Plainfield Community School Corporation designates the following school personnel to conduct the exit interview of a student enrolled at the specified school who wishes to withdraw from school:
